

Signs of sexual coercion and human trafficking are easy to overlook.

CHERISHED HEARTS What you need to know:

- Up to 2-Year Commitment
- Trauma-informed Treatment Services -Participants are assessed and referred for treatment according to their needs and goals.
- Low Participant Ratio The program has fewer participants per Case Manager than traditional probation. This allows for more one-on-one attention with participants.
- Ongoing Judicial Interaction Participants will initially meet with Judge once per week. Frequency of court attendance decreased as participant advances in programming.
- Frequent Drug Testing Participants will be randomly screened a minimum of twice per week.
- Graduation To graduate, participants must complete the five (5) phases of programming.

The Cherished HEARTS program works to decrease recidivism of its participants by offering community services and community integration to address the needs of legally involved human trafficking survivors.

Individuals may have a history of:

- A controlling partner, relative, friend, or employer
- · A partner who is much older
- Fear of punishment for leaving a relationship
- Having few or no personal possessions

- Forced Isolation from supportive relationships
- · Not knowing who your parent or legal guardian is (as a minor)
- · Hotel stays with abusive incidents
- Gang involvement
- Substance use
