

ATHENA'S COURT

The **Athena's Court** program works to decrease recidivism of its participants by offering community services and community integration to address the needs of justice-involved individuals who have experienced human trafficking or are at risk of sexual exploitation.

- Individuals often do not self-identify
- as being trafficked
- Women, children, and transgender individuals are among the highest affected groups
- 32% of individuals who are trafficked were recruited by an intimate partner
- Most traffickers use psychological means such as, tricking, defrauding, manipulating or threatening victims
